Dennis P. McHugh Piermont Public Library Director's Report August 13, 2025

General Library Updates

The RCLS Road Trip program has been going strong. We've had 19 Piermont cardholders begin their road trips here, and we have had 98 visitors from other libraries come in to get their passports stamped, to enter the monthly raffles, and to discover our beautiful library! Several staff from RCLS have also stopped in on their own road trips and have been consistently delighted to meet our staff.

Programming

Adults

- -Our Canasta groups reported their automatic deck shufflers were in bad shape, so we ordered new equipment for these programs. We also started a 6-week library sponsored Beginner Canasta class on Friday mornings, which have been filled to capacity each week.
- -Movies for adults are back! We offered two Tuesday evening movies in July and have scheduled weekly Friday afternoon films for August. We purchased an air popper and popcorn bags to offer our patrons the movie theater experience.
- -Trivia Night was a success! We had six players, who played two full games of Jeopardy-style trivia. All of the attendees indicated that they would attend again and requested a monthly offering of this program.
- -Create and Sip with Alexis Starke for adults drew thirteen artists.
- -Patrons enjoyed the botanical art of Laurie Peek throughout the month, and 42 attended the reception.
- -14 attendees learned how to illustrate children's books using digital methods during an excellent presentation from children's illustrator Betsy Franco-Feeney.
- -Adults have been entering weekly Summer Reading raffles, consisting of short book reviews, for Bunbury gift certificates. So far, we have received 37 adult submissions.

Young Adult

-Teens can also enter summer reading, though we have only had 1 participant this month.

-We have been hearing interest in reviving the Youth Advisory group after the summer again, so we are keeping a list of interested teens to contact in early September. The goal is to have teens meet twice a month going forward.

Children

- -We've had Summer Reading drop-in programming available every day this month, courtesy of Ms. Nancy and the efforts of the entire staff. This has involved drop-in crafts, weekly reading tallies, and a "Guess How Many M&Ms" contest (the answer was 1204, with 73 guesses entered!), along with our regular programming such as Family Bingo and Fun for 3s and 4s. Our end of the month Summer Reading Pizza Party was impacted by a severe thunderstorm, but eight attendees still came out to enjoy some slices!
- -Storytime with Ms. Nancy continues to fill the room to capacity. In August, Storytime will be rescheduled from Monday mornings to Wednesday mornings, and our Monday attendees were informed of this change throughout the month.
- -July art classes with Alexis remained consistently popular and required waitlists. Art classes will be on break for August but will resume in September.

Staff

-Library staff 3% raises approved by the Board in June went into effect in July.

Technology

-Frontline completed their work replacing our outdated computers with brand new machines. Four staff computers and four public computers were replaced. Four other public computers were removed to better reflect current usage levels. Two of the old computers have been repurposed into catalog browsing computers, so that patrons now have the option to search the catalog and place holds on their own if they wish. The other two carrels are available for private study use, which grants us more seating options for patrons when we utilize the Hudson Room for large programs.

The new public PCs are also now outfitted with Deep Freeze software, which will clear any patron details after sessions, including browsing history, login information, and any files downloaded or saved to the hard drive. Patron data and privacy will be better protected.

Collections


- -Our physical circulation this month surpassed 1000 (1120 total) for the first time in years.
- -Physical magazine circulation remains low (zero this month), while digital circulation has been healthy. Our print selection is sparse, so we are going to research which digital titles circulate well for consideration in our print collection.

Building

- -Our front porch lights shorted out recently and we will need to have an electrician come in to determine the problem.
- -Our book drop has seen better days, so we will be researching potential replacements.
- -We submitted the initial application for the NYS Public Library Construction Aid Grant, which could fund up to 50% of a qualifying project. We have applied for aid in reconstructing the front porch deck and staircase, ramp, and back entrance staircase. Awards will be announced by September 2026.






