General Library Updates

The RCLS Road Trip program has continued to go strong throughout the summer. There were 75 visitors to our library. The program will run until the end of September. RCLS was able to add additional "grand prizes" into the mix, so it's still a great time to get started on, or to continue, an RCLS road trips!

Programming

Adults

- Our 6-week library sponsored Beginner Canasta class wrapped up in the middle of the month. Patrons gave us positive feedback on this program and we intend to bring it back in the Spring.
- -We tried movies for adults on Friday afternoons at 2pm in August. Attendance was generally low, as we expected given general program attendance trends in August, but those who did attend enjoyed popcorn with their flicks! We will continue to offer films at this time to hopefully build a consistent audience.
- -Create and Sip with Alexis Starke for adults drew eighteen artists, and she also offered an End of Summer art class for nine children. We are looking forward to Alexis's art classes this Fall!
- -Patrons enjoyed the art of Elizabeth Lauri and Lisa D'Amico all month, and 21 attended the Tuesday night reception on August 5.
- -Adults continued to enter weekly Summer Reading raffles, consisting of short book reviews, for Bunbury gift certificates. 38 adults and one teen participated, and sixteen prizes were distributed.
- -Assemblyman Aron Wieder held mobile office hours on August 19, and twelve constituents attended.
- -We hosted a lecture form aviation historian and pilot Susan Lorricchio on Tuesday, August 26 about Amelia Earhart. Our evening staff, Dylan and Robert, went above and beyond in saving the day technology-wise to get the presentation working and 12 attendees were treated to a phone call with the Program Manager of Nauticos, who is currently planning a new expedition in search of Earhart.

Young Adult

-In mid-September we will be posting and sending information to recruit for the Youth Advisory Klub.

Children

- -Back by very popular demand, our Mighty Five Scavenger Hunt delighted 140 participants, who explored every corner of our library and received painting sets as their grand prizes.
- -Storytime with Ms. Nancy continues to fill the room to capacity, and our patrons adjusted very quickly and positively to the Wednesday Storytime scheduling change (previously was offered on Mondays)
- -Family Bingo entertained a group of 8.
- -Art classes were on break for August but will resume in September.

Staff

-John Ballard has resigned from weeknight shifts but will continue to staff the library on Saturdays. Scheduling adjustments have been made to adequately staff the vacant shifts until additional staffing is worked out.

Technology

-Staff and patrons alike have expressed positive feedback on our new computers, which have been working lighting fast!

Collections


-Circulation, both print and digital, has shown general increases compared to last year.






